## Masonry Career Technical Program Country Haven Center, Mansfield Correctional Institution (ManCI), DRC

I have worked for the ODR&C as the Masonry School Instructor for 25 years. I have been married to my wife Julie for 26 years with one child, Dale. Julie is an Administrative Assistant with Ashland University. Dale graduated from Hocking College with a degree in Heavy Equipment Management. He is currently an apprentice with Kokosing Construction Company.

I attended NCTC studying Architectural Drafting and Design while working construction for my father's company. In the fall of 1984 I moved to Colorado to work as a concrete finisher until the summer of 1987. During that time I worked on several projects, for Digital Corporation Company, then Fort Carson Army base, where we built a Vehicle Maintenance facility with tank parking lots. I worked inside NORAD repairing concrete floors. I continued to work for my father's construction company until I was hired to teach the Masonry School at ManCI in 1991. You could say I was born into the masonry trade and followed in the footsteps of my uncle Alfred Shoup who was the first Masonry School instructor at OSR in 1968. I was hired in 1991, when the school was moved to ManCI.

I attended NCCER Instructor Certification in 2001 to become a certified trainer for Construction Core Curriculum and Masonry Level One. During 2008, I attended OSHA thirty-hour Instructor Certification course to improve my teaching abilities and benefit my students. I continue to take professional development classes through CEA and Ashland University.

My students receive 600+ hours of Masonry training and become nationally registered through the NCCER in Core Curriculum and Masonry Level One. They also receive OSHA 10 Occupational Safety and Health training card through Cincinnati University and registered in the National OSHA Safety Database.

Students also receive on the job training projects with the maintenance department at ManCI.

Currently we poured concrete sidewalks for the clinic area.

In my spare time I enjoy volunteering for the VFW. I relax in my garden growing garlic and vegetables. I also enjoy fishing and hunting.
